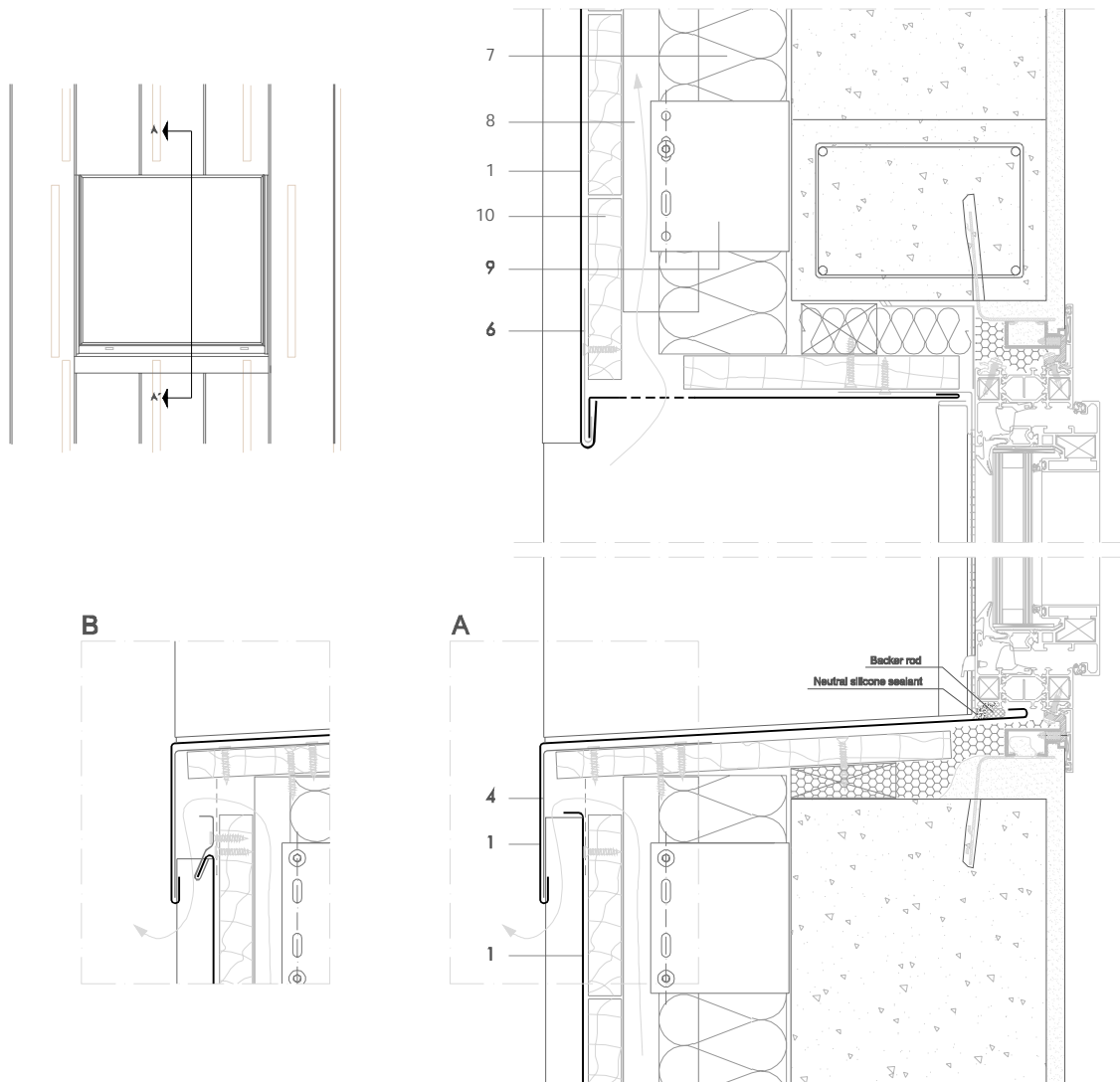


ASS V 7.1.01 Vertical window section - vented sill.

Sheet thickness may be exaggerated for clarity

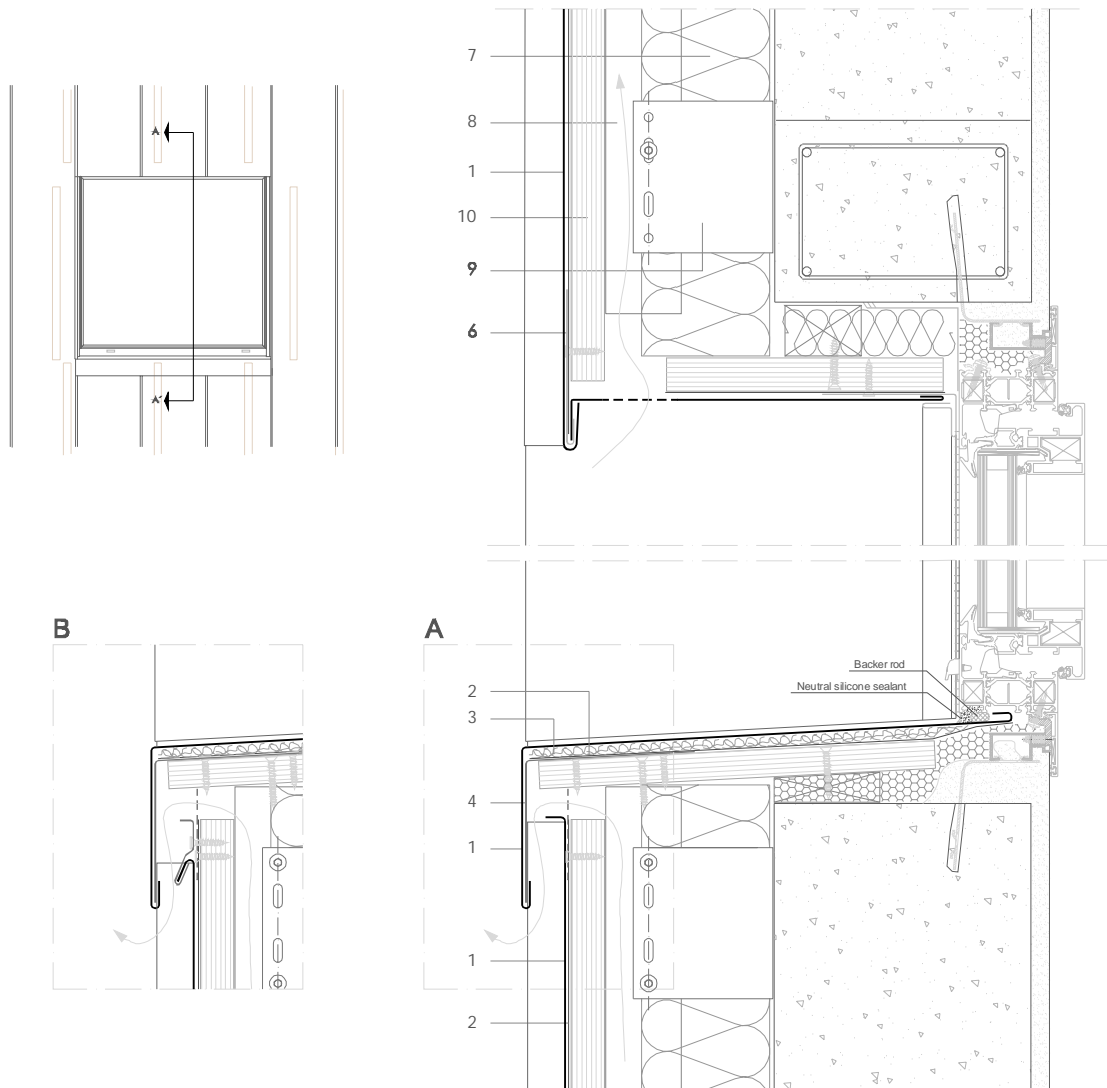

Notes:

- Used for wide windows with a vented sill. For narrow windows with an un-vented sill, see ASS V 7.2.01. y ASS V 7.2.02.
- The elevation corresponds to windows lined up with vertical joints.
- For horizontal section see ASS V 7.1.02.
- 'A' with sheet cladding, 'B' with long strip cladding. It is recommended to overlap the cladding with the sill by a minimum of 60mm.
- Generic structural details are given for indicative purposes only.
